Public Health Warning Against the Purchase and Use of

Cosmetic Product "SKIN MAGICALTM

REJUVENATING FACIAL TONER NO. 3" Containing

Banned Ingredient/s

The Food and Drug Administration (FDA) warns the public from purchasing and using the adulterated cosmetic product SKIN MAGICALTM REJUVENATING FACIAL TONER NO. 3 which tested positive for the presence of HYDROQUINONE and TRETINOIN. Such ingredients are not allowed to be part of a cosmetic product as per Annex II Part 1 of the ASEAN Cosmetic Directive. The aforementioned adulterated product is found to be non-compliant with the existing standards, and, thus pose potential hazards to the consuming public. The use of adulterated cosmetic products may result to adverse reactions, including but not limited to, skin irritation, itchiness, anaphylactic shock and organ failure.

In light of the foregoing, the public is advised not to purchase the aforementioned adulterated product. Moreover, the public is advised to always check if a cosmetic product is notified with the FDA. The FDA website (www.fda.gov.ph.) has a Search feature which may be used by typing in the name of the product before purchasing.

All concerned establishments are warned not to distribute adulterated cosmetic products.

All FDA Regional Field Offices and Regulatory Enforcement Units, in coordination with law enforcement agencies and Local Government Units, are requested to ensure that violative products are not sold or made available in the market or areas of jurisdiction.
