We are furnishing you a copy of the communication of Mr. Raul M. Santiago Jr., Office of the Undersecretary for International Economic Relations (QUIER), DFA, dated 05 July 2004, regarding Jordan's regulation on the importation of fresh, frozen and chilled chicken meat and its products.

The regulation states that "every cooled or fresh chicken must be covered by a suitable plastic materials, provided that it is transparent, colorless and does not affect the chicken's taste or smell like the polyethylene. Non-compliance to this regulation would not be allowed to enter in the Jordan market.
