Public Health Warning Against the Purchase and Consumption of the following Unregistered Piping Rock Food Supplements:

- 1. PIPING ROCK CALAMARINE SUPER DHA 500 FROM CALAMARI
- 2. PIPING ROCK COQ-10 ABSORBABLE, 100mg
- 3. PIPING ROCK GABA, 750mg
- 4. PIPING ROCK MULTI AMINOS
- 5. PIPING ROCK ULTIMATE PROBIOTIC-10 ACIDOPHILUS WITH PREBIOTIC
- 6. PIPING ROCK PROBIOTIC ACIDOPHILUS, 1.5mg
- 7. PIPING ROCK PROBITOIC-10 WITH FOS

The Food and Drug Administration (FDA) advises the public against the purchase and consumption of the following unregistered PIPING ROCK food supplements:




Figure 1. Unregistered PIPING ROCK Calamarine Super DHA 500 from Calamari




Figure 2. Unregistered PIPING ROCK CoQ-10 Absorbable, 100mg








Figure 3. Unregistered PIPING ROCK GABA, 750 mg




Figure 4. Unregistered PIPING ROCK Multi AMinos




Figure 5. Unregistered PIPING ROCK Ultimate Probiotic-10 Acidophilus with Prebiotic




Figure 6. Unregistered PIPING ROCK Probiotic Acidophilus, 1.5mg




Figure 7. Unregistered PIPING ROCK Probitoc-10 with FOS, 25 Billion Organisms

FDA post-marketing surveillance (PMS) activities have verified that the abovementioned food supplements have not gone through the registration process of the agency and have not been issued the proper authorization in the form of Certificate of Product Registration. Pursuant to Republic Act No. 9711, otherwise known as the "Food and Drug Administration Act of 2009", the manufacture, importation, exportation, sale, offering for sale, distribution, transfer, nonconsumer use, promotion, advertising or sponsorship of health products without the proper authorization from FDA is prohibited.

Accordingly, since unregistered food supplements have not gone through evaluation and testing process of the FDA, the agency cannot guarantee their quality and safety. The consumption of such violative products may pose potential health hazard to the consuming public. Food products including food supplements should not bear any misleading, deceptive, and false claims in their labels and/or any promotional materials that will provide erroneous impression on products' character or identity.

In light of the foregoing, the public is advised not to purchase the aforementioned violative products. Moreover, the public is advised to be vigilant against food products that might not be duly registered with FDA. Always check if a food product has been registered with FDA before purchasing it by making use of the embedded *Search* feature of the FDA website accessible at <a href="https://www.fda.gov.ph.">www.fda.gov.ph.</a>

All concerned establishments are warned not to distribute the above-identified violative food products until they have already been covered by the appropriate authorization (product registration), otherwise, regulatory actions and sanctions shall be strictly pursued.

All Local Government Units (LGUs) and Law Enforcement Agencies (LEAs) are requested to ensure that these products are not sold or made available in their localities or areas of jurisdiction.
