 - 5.6 Applicable emission controls for suspected emissions;
 - 5.7 Potential hazards/toxicities of waste residues;
 - 5.8 Energy efficiency
 - 5.9 Occupational safety and health assurance.

- 7. Layout / Plans
 - 7.1 Location of installation;
 - 7.2 Design / Drawing or picture of the device / equipment applied for;
- 8. Supplementary requirements for equipment / devices used for chemical disinfection:
