Special Provision(s)

1. Value-Added Tax in liew of Franchise Tax. In addition to the amounts appropriated hereim, Twenty Mine Million Four Hundred Twenty Thousand Pesos (P29,420,000) shall be sourced from Value-Added Tax in lieu of Franchise Tax on gross receipts collected by the following agencies from horse races and shall be used for the indicated purposes:

- (a) Twenty-four percent (244) of the collections from Manila Jockey Club, Inc. (NJCI) in accordance with Section 6 of R.A. No. 6631, as amended, and twenty-four percent (244) of the collections from Philippine Racing Commission, Inc. (PHILRACON) in accordance with Section 8 of R.A. No. 6632, as amended, to augment the operating requirements of the Philippine Anti-Tuberculosis Society;
- (b) Eight percent (8%) of the collections from MJCI in accordance with Section 6 of R.A. No. 6631, as amended, and eight percent (8%) of the collections from PMILRACOM in accordance with Section 8 of R.A. No. 6632, as amended, to augment the operating requirements of the White Cross, Inc.; and
- (c) Twenty-eight percent (28%) of the collections from PHILRACOM is accordance with Section 8 of R.A. No. 6632, as anended, to augment the operating requirements of the PCSO.

Releases from said amount shall be subject to the submission of a Special Budget pursuant to Section 35, Chapter 5, Book VI of E.O. No. 292, s. 1987.

2. Hospital Income. In addition to the amounts appropriated herein, all income generated from the operation of special hospitals, ordical centers, institute for disease prevention and control, including drug abuse treatment and rehabilitation centers and facilities, and other National Government hospitals under the DOM shall be deposited in an authorized government depository bank and shall be used to augment the hospital's MODE and Capital Outlays including payment of Philhealth premium under the Point of Care Program: PROVIDED, That no amount therefrom shall be used for the payment of salaries, allowances, and other benefits: PROVIDED, FURTHER, That at least twenty-five percent (25%) of the said income shall be used to purchase and upgrade hospital equipment used directly in the delivery of health services.

The DBH shall prepare and submit to the DBM not later than Kovember 15 of the preceding year, the annual operating budget for the current year covering said income and the corresponding expenditures. Likewise, it shall submit to the DBM not later than March 1 of the current year its audited financial statements for the immediately preceding year. The Secretary of Health and the Agency's meb administrator or his/her equivalent shall be responsible for ensuring that said annual reports and the audited financial statements are likewise posted on the official website of the DDM.

Failure to comply with any of the foregoing shall render any disbursement from said income void, and shall subject the erring afficials and employees to disciplinary actions in accordance with Section 43, Chapter 5, and Section 80, Chapter 7, Book VI of E.U. Ma. 292, s. 1987, and to appropriate crisinal action under existing penal laws. (CONDITIONAL IMPLEMENTATION - President's Veto Message, December 23, 2014, Volume LI-B, page 1554, B A, No. 10651)

December 23, 2014, Volume II-B, page 1554, R.A. No. 10651) 3. Fees and Charges of the Bureau of Quarantime and International Health Surveillance. In addition to the amounts appropriated herein, Fifty Six Hillion Pesos (P56,000,000) sourced from fifty percent (50%) of the fees collected by the Bureau of Quarantime and International Health Surveillance (BQIHS) shall be used for the operational requirements of the BQIHS is accordance with Section 9 of R.A. No. 9271.

Releases from said amount shall be subject to the submission of a Special Budget pursmant to Section 35, Chapter 5, Book VI of E.C. No. 292.

The DOB shall submit, to the DBM, the House Committee on Appropriations and the Senate Committee on Finance, quarterly reports on the financial and physical accomplishments of the income of BQINS. The Secretary of Health and the Agency's web administrator or bis/her equivalent shall be responsible for ensuring that said quarterly reports are posted on the official website of the DOH which shall be considered compliance with the said reportarial requirement.

4. Fees, Fines, Royalties and Other Charges of the Food and Drug Administration. In addition to the amounts appropriated herein, Three Hundred Eighty Six Million Five Hundred Thousand Pesos (P386,500,000) sourced from fees, fines, royalties and other charges collected by the Food and Drug Administration (FDA) shall be released to the FDA upon submission of its Five-year Developmental Plan required under R.A. No. 9502 and subject to guidelines to be jointly issued by the DBN, DON and FDA, and the submission of a Special Budget pursuant to Section 35, Chapter 5, Book YI of E.O. No. 292. Said amount shall be utilized by the FDA in accordance with its approved Five-year Developmental Plan to ensure its self-sufficiency.

The FDA shall submit, to the DDM, the House Committee on Appropriations and the Senate Committee on Finance, separate quarterly reports on the physical and financial accomplishments of its income. The Director of FDA and the Agency's web administrator or his/her equivalent shall be responsible for ensuring that said quarterly reports are posted on the official website of the FDA which shall be considered compliance with the said reportorial requirement.

5. Health Facilities Enhancement Program. The amount of Thirteen Billion Two Hundred Seventy One Nillion Three Hundred Kinety Three Thousand Pesos (P13,271,393,000) appropriated berein for the Health Facilities Enhancement Program shall be used to implement the following in compliance with the Philippines' commitment to health by year 2015 under the Millennium Development Goal: (i) the construction, upgrading, expansion, repair and rehabilitation of DOM retained hospitals, and other health care facilities, such as Rural Realth Units, district or provincial hospitals, and barangay health stations; and (ii) the purchase of bospital equipment. Said amount is further allocated, as follows:

PROVIDED, That the amount of Three Billion Six Hundred Winety Six Willion One Hundred Seventy Four Thousand Pesos (P3,696,174,000) appropriated herein for the construction, upgrading, and expansion of LGU Health Care Facilities shall be released directly to the Department of Public Works and Highways (DPWH): PROVIDED, FURTHER, That the DPWH shall implement the construction, opgrading, and expansion of the LGU Health Care Facilities following the architectural and engineering design prescribed by the DOA: PROVIDED, FURTHERMORE, That the DPMH shall construct LGU Health Care Facilities only in lots that are already owned by the government: PROVIDED, FURTHERMORE, That Nealth Facilities Enhancement Projects initially implemented by Local Government Units (LGUs) may be delegated by the DPWH to the said LGUs through the execution of a Memorandum of Agreement: PROVIDED, FURTHERNGRE, That the amount of Six Billion Seven Hundred Twenty Two Hillion Four Hundred Minety One Thousand Pesos (P6,722,491,000) appropriated herein for the construction, upgrading, expansion, repair and rehabilitation of CON retained hospitals and other health care facilities shall be implemented by the DOH through public bidding in accordance with R.A. Ho. 9184 and its implementing rules and regulations (IRR): PROVIDED, FURTHERMORE, That the DPWH and DOX shall be allowed to deduct not more than One-Half Percent (0.5%) each, of the project cost as administrative overhead expense: PROVIDED, FURTHERMORE, That the administrative overhead expense shall not be authorized for infrastructure projects costing One Million Pesos (P1.000.000) and below: PROVIDED. FIWALLY. That releases from said amounts shall be made upon submission to the DAM of the list of retained hospitals and other health care facilities to be constructed, upgraded, expanded, repaired and rehabilitated. The amount of Two Billion Eight Hondred Fifty Two Million Seven Hundred Twenty Eight Thomsand Pesos (P2,852,728,000) appropriated berein for hospital equipment shall be used by the DOH to procure kospital equipment for DOH retained hospitals and other health care facilities to be constructed, apgraded, or expanded: PROVIDED, That in the identification of hospital equipment to be purchased, the DOH shall give preference to equipment needed by DON relained hospitals and other health care facilities located in areas where: (i) there are large number of poor families or households under the National Household Targeting System for Poverty Reduction (NHTS-PR) by the DSMD, or where the facilities are situated near said families; and (ii) there are no other private health care facilities which can provide affordable and quality health care: PROVIDED, FURTHER, That the DOH way procure such hospital equipment in bulk to ensure cost-efficiency, subject to compliance with R.A. No. 9184 and its IRR, and pertiment auditing laws, rules and regulations.

The Secretary of Health and the Agency's web administrator or his/her equivalent shall be responsible for ensuring that the list and cost of DOH retained hospitals and other health care facilities constructed, upgraded, expanded, repaired and rehabilitated, and the list and cost of bospital equipment purchased, including its distribution are posted on the official website of the DOH.

6. Bottom-Up Budgeting (BuB) Projects. The amounts appropriated herein for Environmental and Occupational Health, Family Health and Responsible Parenting, Health Emergency Management, Health Facilities Enhancement Program, Implementation of Doctors to the Barrios and Rural Health Team Placement Program, Other Infectious Diseases (HIV/AIDS, Dengue), Mational Pharmaceutical Policy Bevelopment and Implementation of Various Programs/Projects for LGUs include Thirty One Million Six Hundred Thirty Eight Thousand Pesos (P31,638,000), One Hundred Thirty One Million Six Hundred Sixty Five Thousand Pesos (P131,665,000), Forty Million Two Hundred Hinety Seven Thousand Pesos (P40,297,000), Nine Hundred Eighty Seven Nillion Eight Annadred Fifteen Thousand Pesos (P907,015,000), Seventy One Million Three Hundred Thirty Three Thousand Pesos (P71,333,000), One Hundred Mine Million Six Hundred Mineteen Thousand Pesos (P109,619,000), Ten Million Six Hundred Thousand Pesos (P10,600,000), and Minety Mine Million Two Rundred Twenty Four Thousand Pesos (P99,224,000), which shall be used exclusively for the implementation of Bottom-Up Budgeting (BuB) Projects in the LGUs identified under Volume No. I of this Act. In no case shall said amount be used for any other purpose.

Releases from said amount shall be subject to compliance with the requirements of Good Financial Mousekeeping under the FY 2014 Seal of Good Local Governance and LGU Public Financial Management Improvement Program pursuant to DBM-DILG-DSWD-MAPC JNC No. 4 dated Movember 26, 2013 and such other criteria provided in the guidelines.

The LGUs shall likewise ensure that the cost of implementing the 800 Projects shall not exceed the cost of similar projects being implemented by national government agencies in the same locality.

The DOK shall submit quarterly reports on the financial and physical accomplishments of the amounts appropriated for the BuB Projects to the DBK, the House Committee on Appropriations and the Senate Committee on Finance. The Secretary of Health and the Agency's web administrator or his/her equivalent shall be responsible for ensuring that said reports are posted on the official website of the BOM which shall be considered compliance with the said reportantal requirement.

Implementation of this provision shall be subject to guidelines to be issued by the DBM.

7. National Health Insurance Program for the Indigents and the Poor. The amount of Thirty Seven Billion Sixty Million Four Hundred Forty Thousand Pesos (P37,060,440,000) appropriated herein under Subsidy for Bealth Insurance Premium of Indigent Families enrolled in the National Health Insurance Program shall cover full subsidy for health insurance premium of the following: (i) indigents under the MMTS-PR of the DSMD including the poor and low income that maybe identified by the DSMD, local social worker and medical social worker; (ii) qualified barangay officials including barangay secretary, barangay treasurer, barangay tamods, barangay day care workers and allied health workers that are not receiving salaries from other sources; and (iii) senior citizens: PROVIDED, That said enrollees are not yet covered under any Philhealth insurance program and are not dependents of a principal member: PROVIDED, FURTHER, That the cost of administering the program shall not exceed seven percent (7%) of the amount of premium contributions: PROVIDED, FURTHER, That releases from said amount to Philhealth shall be made through the BTR: PROVIDED, FINALLY, That release of cash allocation shall be based on the certified billing indicating the names of indigent and poor enrollees, barangay officials and workers and senior citizens to be submitted to DBM which shall ensure that there is no duplication in the enrollees.

In the inplementation of this Program, the Philhealth shall ensure that the utilization of said amount for premiums shall be based on the list of indigent and poor enrollees submitted to DBM. (CONDITIONAL IMPLEMENTATION - President's Veto Message, December 23, 2014, Volume II-B, page 1554, R.A. No. 10651)

8. Assistance to Indigent and Poor Patients. The amount of One Billion Eight Hundred Forty Hime Hillion One Hundred Forty Hime Thousand Pesos (P1,849,149,000) appropriated herein under Assistance to Indigent Patients shall be utilized for hospitalization and the grant of assistance to indigent and poor patients including the payment of Philhealth premium under the Point of Care Program: PROVIDED, That the beneficiary shall comply with the requirements of DOH and/or government hospital: PROVIDED, FURTHER, That the DOH shall not release any subsequent cash allocation until fifty percent (50%) of the amount previously released has been liquidated in accordance with the pertiment budgeting and auditing rules and regulations: PROVIDED, FURTHERMORE, That the DOH shall be allowed to utilize up to one percent (1%) of the said amount to cover administrative costs of implementation of this Program: PROVIDED, FURTHERMORE, That the DOH shall submit a quarterly report on the utilization of this amount to the DBM, the Mouse Committee on Appropriations and the Senate Committee on Finance.

<u>The DOR shall post the following on its official website: (i) Name of recipient government bospitals and indigent patients receiving medical services therein, whether confined or out patients; (ii) Type of medical assistance given and other related information; and (iii) Name and address of indigent patients, and medical services rendered to and/or drugs and medicines received by each of them with the corresponding fee or amount. The recipient government hospital shall likewise post the furegoing information on its official website. The Secretary of Health and the Agency's web administrator or bis/ber equivalent shall be responsible for ensuring that said reports are posted on the official website of DON which shall be considered compliance with the said reportorial requirement. (CONDITIONAL IMPLEMENTATION - President's Veto Message. December 23, 2014. Volume LEB, page 154. B. A. No. 10651)</u>

9. Subsidy for Realth Insurance Premium under the PAyapa at MASagamang PamayaMAn Program (PANAMA) and Sajahatra Mangsamoro Programs. The amount of One Hundred Twenty Mine Million Thirty Five Thousand Pesos (P129,035,000) appropriated herein for subsidy for health insurance premium under the PAMAMA and Sajahatra Bangsamore Programs includes the following: (1) Forty Seven Million Seven Hundred Sixty Two Thousand Pesos (P47,762,000) to implement projects in conflict-affected areas already identified by the GPAPP; (2) Fifty Million Four Hundred Thousand Pesos (P47,762,000) for health insurance premiums of targeted beneficiaries under the Socio-Economic Component of the Hormalization Process; (3) Twenty Six Million Four Hundred Thousand Pesos (P26,400,000) for health insurance premiums of targeted beneficiaries already identified under the Sajahatra Bangsamore Program; and (4) Four Million Four Hundred Seventy Three Thousand Pesos (P4,473,000) for health insurance premiums of the three thousand six hundred ninety eight (3,698) actual enrollees for the FY 2013 Sajahatra Bangsamoro Program: PROVIDED, That the subsidy for the health insurance premiums of former rebels and/or their qualified dependents as well as members of identified communities as determined by the OPPAP shall be released to Philhealth, through the 0Fr: PROVIDED, FURTHER, That the release of cash allocation shall be based on the cortified billing indicating the names of enrollees to be submitted to DBM. In no case shall said amount be used for any other purpose.

In the implementation of this Program, the Philhealth shall ensure that the utilization of said amount for premiums shall be based on the list of enrollees submitted to DBH.

The DOB, through the Philhealth, shall submit to the OPAPP, the DDM, the House Committee on Appropriations and the Senate Committee on Finance, quarterly reports on the status of implementation of the PAMAMA Program and the Mormalization Process, and to the Task Force on Bangsamoro Development created under A.O. Mo. 37, s. 2013, quarterly reports on the status of implementation of the Sajahatra Bangsamoro Program. The President of Philhealth and the Corporation's web administrator or his/her equivalent shall be responsible for ensuring that said quarterly reports are posted on the official mebsite of the Philhealth which shall be considered compliance with the said reportorial requirement.

10. Purchase and Allocation of Drugs, Nedicines and Vaccines. The amount of Seven Billion Eight Hundred Eighty Five Nillion Seven Hundred Fifty Four Thousand Pesos (P7,885,754,000) appropriated herein for drugs, medicines and vaccines shall be used for the procurement of drugs, medicines and vaccines including medical and dental supplies for distribution to DOM retained hospitals and other health care facilities: PROVIDED, That releases from said amount shall be made upon submission by the DOM of its distribution list of the drugs, medicines and vaccines per health care facility in every province: PROVIDED, FURTHER, That in the preparation of the distribution list, the DOM shall allocate eighty percent (80%) of the drugs, medicines and vaccines to provinces where: (i) there are large number of poor families or bouseholds under the NHTS-PR by the DSMD; and (ii) the absolute number of poor and the incidence of poverty are high as identified in the latest official poverty statistics of the PSA-NSCB: PROVIDED, FURTHERMORE, That any available allotment from the procurement of drugs, medicines and vaccines shall be used to purchase additional drugs, medicines and vaccines to be distributed in accordance with the above-stated allocation.

Notwithstanding the allocation of drugs, medicines and vaccines as provided in the above distribution list submitted by the DOH to the DBM, the Secretary of Nealth may reallocate the provision of drugs, medicines and vaccines when mecessitated by the occurrence of disease outbreaks, calamities and other emergencies during the year.

The procurement of drugs, medicines and vaccines by the DOH, including regional hospitals, medical centers and special hospitals, shall strictly comply with R.A. Ho. 9502, E.O. Ho. 821, s. 2009, and the Philippine Mational Drug Formulary: PROVIDED, That bulk procurement of drugs, medicines, and vaccines, including medical or dental supplies, equipment and instruments may also be allowed, subject to compliance with R.A. Ho. 9184 and its IRR, and pertiment auditing laws, rules and regulations.

The DOH shall submit, to the DON, the House Committee on Appropriations, and the Senate Committee on Finance, quarterly reports on the allocation of drugs, medicines and vaccines by province and the actual distribution to recipient DOH retained hospitals and other health care facilities. The Secretary of Health and the Agency's web administrator or his/her equivalent shall be responsible for ensuring that said quarterly reports are posted on the official website of the DOH which shall be considered compliance with the said reportorial requirement.

11. Reimbursement for Drugs and Medicines, and Vaccines. The amount appropriated herein for drugs, medicines and vaccines shall be used for the parchase of drugs, medicines and vaccines for distribution to DOH retained hospitals and other health care facilities: PROVIDED, That the drugs, medicines and vaccines shall be availed of through the use of Philhealth card: PROVIDED, FURTHER, That the amount of reimbursements made by Philhealth shall be used exclusively by the DOK for the construction of additional health care facilities, including the purchase and upgrade of hospital equipment: PROVIDED, FIMALLY, That in no case shall said amount be used for the payment of salaries and other allowances.

12. Procurement of Vaccines for Indigent Senior Citizens. The amount appropriated herein for Hon-Communicable Disease Prevention and Control and Expanded Program on Immunization includes the procurement of vaccines for indigent senior citizens.

The DOH shall impediately implement its annual procurement plan for said vaccines to ensure the timely procurement and distribution thereof.

13. Advance Payment for Drugs and Vaccines Procured from International Cooperating Agencies. The DOH is authorized to deposit or pay in advance the amount necessary for the procurement of drugs and vaccines from the Morld Health Organization, the United Nations International Children's Emergency Fund, and the Deutsche Gesellschaft für Technische Zusammenarbeit (GTZ) GmbH.

14. Pinoy ND Scholarship Program. The amount appropriated herein for the implementation of the Pinoy ND Scholarship Program shall be limited to scholars who have taken and passed the qualifying examinations administered by any of the DDH-partner schools and complied with the criteria set forth by the DDH: PROVIDED, That priority shall be given to poor and deserving students or those coming from families belonging to the low-income bracket as determined by the PSA-MSCB. The DDH shall develop a database that will effectively provide periodic monitoring of the program's scholars.

The DOM shall submit to the DOM, the House Committee on Appropriations and the Senate Committee on Finance, quarterly reports on the financial and physical accomplishments of the Program, including the list of scholars. The Secretary of the DOM and the Agency's web administrator or his/her equivalent shall be responsible for ensuring that said quarterly reports are posted on the officiel website of the DOM which shall be considered compliance with the said reportorial requirement.

15. Deployment of Medical Workers. In the deployment of doctors, midwives, nurses and other medical workers, the DOM shall give priority to localities where the absolute number of poor and the incidence of poverty are high as identified in the latest official poverty statistics of the PSA-MSCH.

16. Allocation for Autonomous Region in Muslim Mindamao from Mationally Funded Projects. The DOH shall ensure that the requirements of ARMM are provided in the regional allocation of its nationally funded programs and projects. The Secretary of Mealth and the Agency's web administrator or his/her equivalent shall be responsible for ensuring that the amounts allocated for ARMM per province are posted on the official mebsite of the DOM.

Likewise, the ARGHM shall submit, to the DBM and DDH, separate quarterly reports on the implementation and status of all DDH funded programs and projects per province in the ARMM. The Regional Governor of ARGHM and the Regional Government's meb administrator or his/her equivalent shall be responsible for ensuring that said quarterly reports are likewise posted on the official website of the ARGMM.

17. Preventive Health Care Program. The amounts appropriated herein under Disease Prevention and Control shall be used exclusively for the following preventive health care programs: (i) Health Emergency Management; (ii) Elimination of Disease as Public Threat; (iii) Rabies Control Program; (iv) Expanded Program on Immunization; (v) Tuberculosis Control; (vi) Other Infectious Diseases and Emerging and Re-emerging Diseases including HIV or AIDS, Dengue, Food and Mater Borne Diseases; (vii) Hon-Communicable Disease Prevention and Control; **GENERAL APPROPRIATIONS ACT, FY 2015** 

(viii) Family Health and Responsible Parenting; and (ix) Environmental and Occupational Health, as well as the amount appropriated herein for the Mational Pharmaceutical Policy Devalopment. In no case shall said amounts be used for any other purpose.

18. Project Modification. The Secretary of Health is authorized to approve the modification of projects under the Health Facilities Enhancement Program in the following instances: (i) change in the location of the DOH retained hospital or other health care facility to be constructed or change of the DOH retained hospital or other health care facility to be upgraded, expanded, repaired or rehabilitated, as the case may be, due to duplication or double funding of projects, peace and other issues, and other policy considerations, as may be determined by the Secretary of Realth; and (ii) change in the scope of work: PROVIDED, That the modification may only be undertaken once per project and until the end of the second quarter: PROVIDED, FURTHER, That the allotment released has not yet been obligated for the priginal project or scope of work.

The DOH shall inform the DBM, in writing, of every modification within five (5) calendar days from its approval. The Secretary of Health and the Agency's meb administrator or his/her equivalent shall be responsible for ensuring that such modification is likewise posted on the official website of the DOB within the same period.

19. Quick Response Fund. The amount of Five Nundred Million Pesos (P500,000,000) appropriated herein for the Quick Response Fund (QRF) shall serve as a stand-by fund to be used for the repair and rehabilitation of health facilities, replacement of medical equipment, as well as provision for emergency medical assistance, including pre-positioning of medical aids, in order that the situation and living conditions of people living in communities or areas stricken by calamities, epidemics, crises and catastrophes, which occurred in the last quarter of the immediately preceding year and those occurring during the current year may be normalized as quickly as possible. In no case shall the QRF be used for pre-disaster activities or any other purpose not authorized in this provision.

The DOM shall submit, to the National Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Council, the DOM, the House Committee on Appropriations and the Senate Committee on Finance, quarterly reports on the status of the utilization of the QRF. The Secretary of Kealth and the Agency's web administrator or his/ber equivalent shall be responsible for emsuring that said quarterly reports are posted on the official website of the DOH which shall be considered compliance with the said reportorial requirement.

20. Appropriations for Programs and Specific Activities. The amounts appropriated herein for the programs of the agency shall be used specifically for the following activities in the indicated amounts and conditions:
