TO: ALL HEALTHCARE PROFESSIONALS AND THE GENERAL PUBLIC

SUBJECT: Public Health Warning Against the Purchase and Use of Household Urban Hazardous Substances (HUHS) Product NIKKO SPRAY ALL PURPOSE QUICK DRYING HIGH GLOSS ACRYLIC 164 GRASS GREEN Containing Toxic Levels of Heavy Metal/s

The Food and Drug Administration (FDA) warns all healthcare professionals and the general public **NOT TO PURCHASE AND USE** the household urban hazardous substances product **NIKKO SPRAY ALL PURPOSE QUICK DRYING HIGH GLOSS ACRYLIC 164 GRASS GREEN** which tested positive and found to contain toxic **LEAD (Pb)** levels beyond the maximum limit of 90 parts per million (ppm). The table below indicates the particulars of the violative household urban hazardous substances product/s:

The aforementioned violative household urban hazardous substances product is found to be non-compliant with the existing standards, and, thus pose potential hazards to the general public.

Lead is a cumulative toxicant that affects multiple body systems and is particularly harmful to young children and can suffer profound and permanent adverse health effects, particularly affecting the development of the brain and nervous system. It also causes long-term harm in



adults, including increased risk of high blood pressure and kidney damage. Exposure of pregnant women to high levels of lead can cause miscarriage, stillbirth, premature birth and low birth weight. There is no permissible level of exposure to lead that is known to be without harmful effects.

All concerned establishments are warned not to distribute violative household urban hazardous substances products.

All FDA Regional Field Offices and Regulatory Enforcement Units, in coordination with Law Enforcement Agencies (LEAs) and Local Government Units (LGUs), are requested to ensure that violative products are not sold or made available in the market or areas of their jurisdiction.
